**Grades: PK-5 || October 12, 2011 @ Goucher College**

"Who'll help me plant the seed?" asks the plucky red hen as she begins the process that goes into making a loaf of her delicious bread. "Not us", say the sheep, the cow, the horse, and the pig. They all have better things to do. But, "a hen's gotta do what a hen's gotta do," and so our crimson heroine perseveres until her work is done. But, the tricks of the conniving fox combine with the hen's common sense to add adventure and a sound moral lesson to this classic, feel good, foot-stompin' country musical. This show has plenty of audience participation.

**The Hundred Dresses**

Grades: 2-6 || March 28 @ Goucher College

Wanda Petronski, the new girl in room 13, wears the same faded blue dress to school every day, but insists that she has a hundred bright, shiny new ones at home. As Wanda’s story unfolds, her classmates learn the secret of the hundred dresses and with it, a lesson in tolerance, in taking responsibility and in living with the consequences of our actions. An endearing tale, based on the Newbery Honor Book by Eleanor Estes, THE HUNDRED DRESSES focuses on the difficult issue of bullying and how mistreating someone because he or she is different from oneself brings as much harm to the bully as to the victim.

**The Wizard of Oz**

Grades: PK-6 || April 12 @ Goucher College

Explore the enchanting land over the rainbow where dreams really do come true! Make fast friends with the most famous companions in all literature. Follow the yellow brick road on a magical musical journey and share Dorothy's fantastic adventures as the stage is transformed into a world of the imagination. This original musical adaptation follows Dorothy and her dog Toto as their Kansas home is swept away by a cyclone and they find themselves in a wonderful and strange land called Oz. The score includes such treasured songs as Over the Rainbow, Ding Dong! The Witch is Dead, Follow the Yellow Brick Road, If I Only Had a Brain, We're Off to See the Wizard and King of the Forest.

**The Rainbow Fish **NEW****

Grades: PK-2 || April 13 @ Chesapeake Arts Center

With her lovely coloring and shimmering scales, the Rainbow Fish is used to being the most beautiful creature in the ocean. So when the other fish ask her for some silver scales, she refuses. How can she sacrifice the one thing that makes her so unique? Will some good advice from the wise old Octopus persuade the Rainbow Fish to share her gifts with those around her? This performance has turned *Marcus Pfister's* bestselling book into a delightful and touching musical about the value of sharing true friendship with others.

**The House on Pooh Corner NEW**

Grades: PK-5 || April 24 @ Goucher College

Whether we are very young or wise to the ways of the world, every so often each of us has to "get back to the House at Pooh Corner" to spend some tender time with faithful friends. You know their names by heart: Piglet, Eeyore, Tigger, Kanga and Roo, Rabbit, Christopher Robin, and of course, that loveable bear called Winnie-the-Pooh. This production is faithfully based on the A. A. Milne classic of the same name. Featured stories portray the building of Eeyore's house, Tigger's arrival in the Hundred Acre Wood, the origin of the game of Pooh Sticks, Rabbit's plan for reducing Tigger's bounce, and Christopher Robin's growing up and leaving for school.

**Dancing through South Africa NEW**

Grades: PK-12 || April 26 @ Chesapeake Arts Center

Dance your way to the tip of the African continent! Experience three exciting cultures... Traditional *Ndlamu* dance from Zulu villages that give a snapshot of the clothing, customs, live drumming and high energy of South Africa...the moves and percussive sounds of *Gumboot*, a kind of "instant messaging" dance slapped out on gold miners' rubber boots...and *Pantsula*, an upbeat urban dance like American hip-hop but with a cultural twist, that audience volunteers are invited to learn!

**A Perfect Balance: Art. Math. Physics. Teamwork. NEW -- Workshops Available**

Grades: PK-12 || May 1 @ Goucher College

Inspired by the work of American artist Alexander Calder (the inventor of the mobile), this play follows a young artist, Sandy, on his quest to capture his vision of life. Challenged by his father to create a "masterpiece," Sandy playfully experiments with drawing, painting and sculpting, accompanied by his puppet-like circus creations - his muse Fioni-of-the-flying-trapeze, his friend Ringmaster Loyal and his foe, Monsieur Critique. Only when Sandy risks taking his shapes "off the page" does he find his way to the show's spectacular conclusion -- **a mobile, 17 feet across, that suspends into the audience.**

**Cuentos del Arbol "Tree Tales"**

Grades: K-6 || May 4 @ Goucher College

A delightful bi-lingual musical drawn from Spanish and Latin American folklore. Bringing Spanish to "life" for students studying the language; and to make theatre accessible for students for whom English is a second language. Because the play is presented in a bi-lingual format it provides literacy enhancement in both language and the arts. The stories offer pride in the cultural heritage of Spain and Latin America while also providing access to the arts and arts education without a language barrier.

**Animal Tales & Dragon Scales NEW**

Grades: PK-4 || May 7 @ Goucher College

Geared to younger audience's interest and fascination with animal characters, this presentation gives the little ones plenty of opportunities to sing and play along with the pros. Stories include a cautionary fable about a lion and a cloud, the story of a tap dancing dinosaur and an entertaining, interactive song about mammals of the sea.

**The Magic of Science NEW**

Grades: K-5 || May 7 @ Goucher College

Mr. Fish and Lisa Lou use magic tricks and circus skills to help explain atoms, molecules, the elements, compounds, solutions, magnetism, and static electricity. Using ingredients found in everyday life, a balloon inflates all by itself, plain water changes colors and disappears, and liquids "magically" become solids. Whether juggling "atoms" and "molecules," or explaining electrons as their hair stands on end (with the help of a VanDeGraaf generator), this delightful show beguiles the audience while introducing simple and effective science concepts. Some may remember Mr. Fish from "Super Scientific Circus".
