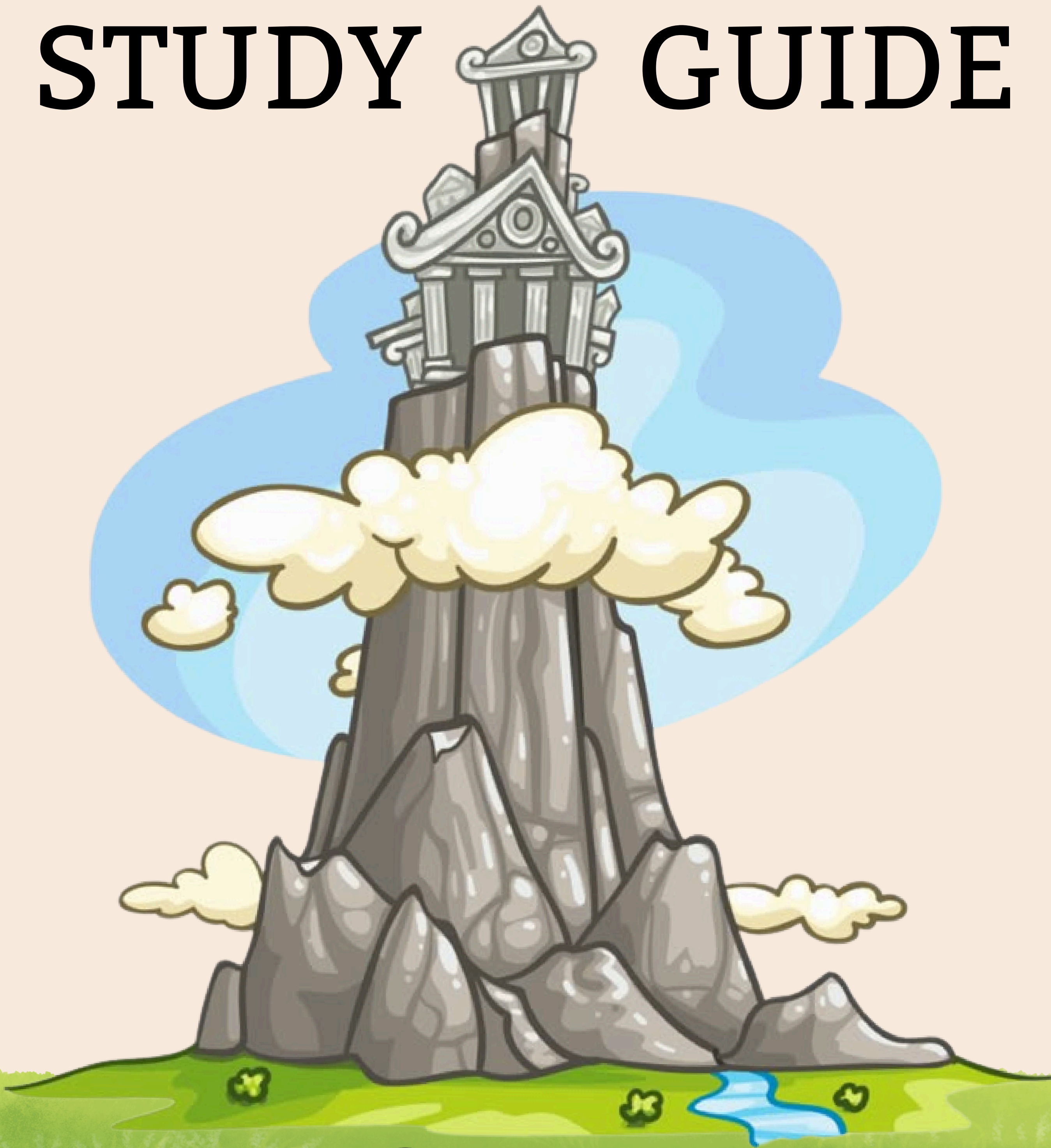

What's The Story?

Tales of Olympus: A Greek Myth Musical is a high-energy, heart-filled musical that brings ancient Greek myths to life with a modern twist. The show retells classic tales like Pandora's Box, Narcissus and Echo, Arachne and Athena, and Persephone and Hades, using catchy songs, humor, and a creative ensemble cast. Each story teaches lessons about curiosity, pride, love, transformation, and the natural world. At the center of it all are the gods of Mount Olympus, who watch over the mortals and sometimes stir up a little drama themselves. The show invites us to think about how ancient myths still connect to our lives today—with laughs, lessons, and a whole lot of music.

Terms To Know

Myth – A traditional story used to explain natural events, history, or customs, often involving gods or supernatural beings.

Underworld – In Greek mythology, the place where souls go after death, ruled by Hades.

Hubris – Extreme pride or arrogance, often leading to a character's downfall.

Oracle – A person or place believed to deliver wise or prophetic messages from the gods.

Muse – A source of inspiration; in Greek mythology, the nine Muses inspired art, music, and literature.

Curiosity – A desire to learn or know more; in myths, curiosity often leads to important discoveries—or trouble!

Zeus – King of the gods; god of the sky and thunder.

Hera – Queen of the gods; goddess of marriage and family.

Athena – Goddess of wisdom, war strategy, and crafts.

Hades – God of the underworld and the dead.

Demeter – Goddess of the harvest and agriculture.

Persephone – Goddess of spring and the queen of the underworld.

Apollo – God of the sun, music, and prophecy.

Artemis – Goddess of the moon, hunting, and animals.

Hermes – Messenger god; also god of travelers and trickery.

Aphrodite – Goddess of love and beauty.

Dionysus – God of wine, celebration, and theatre.

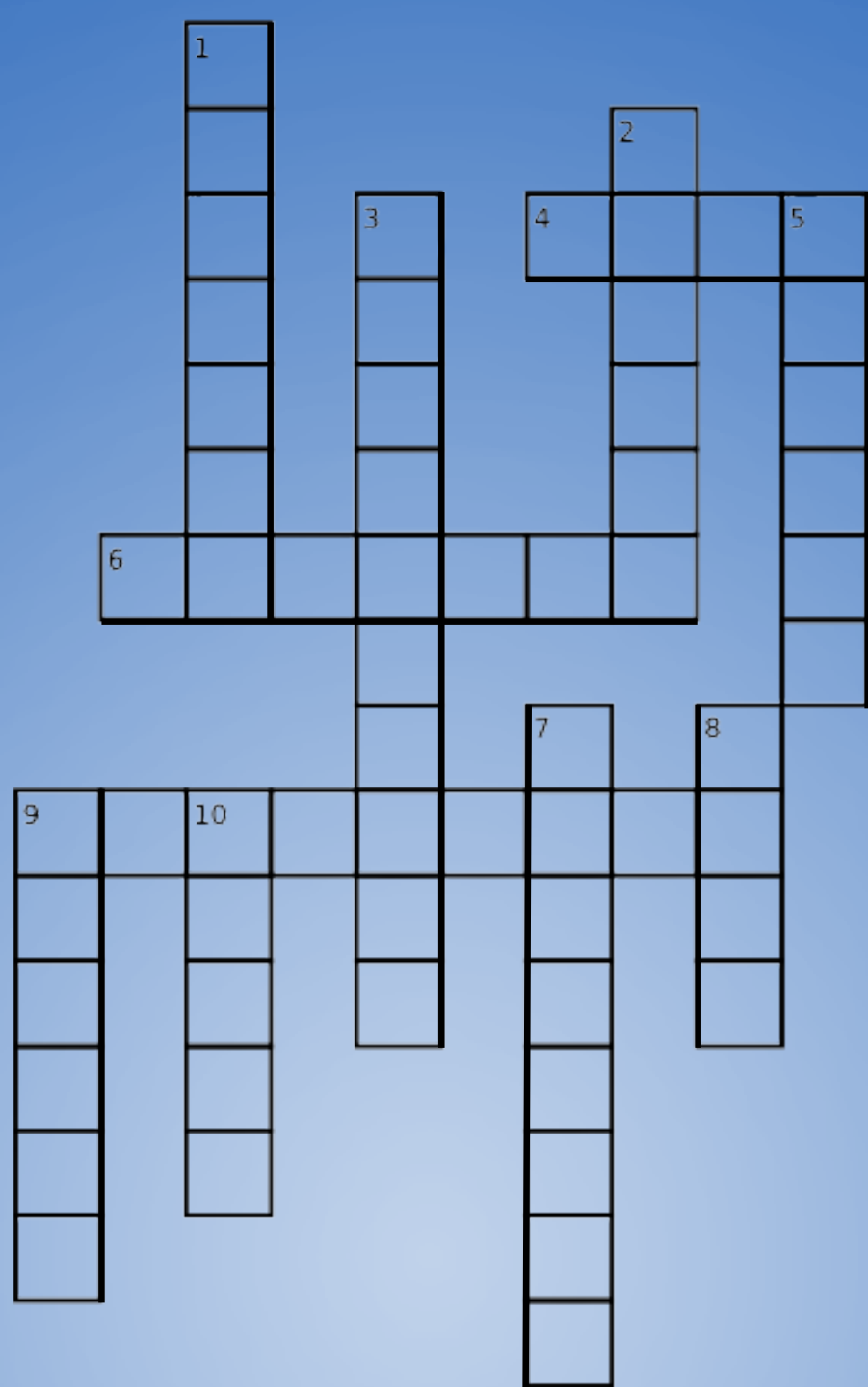

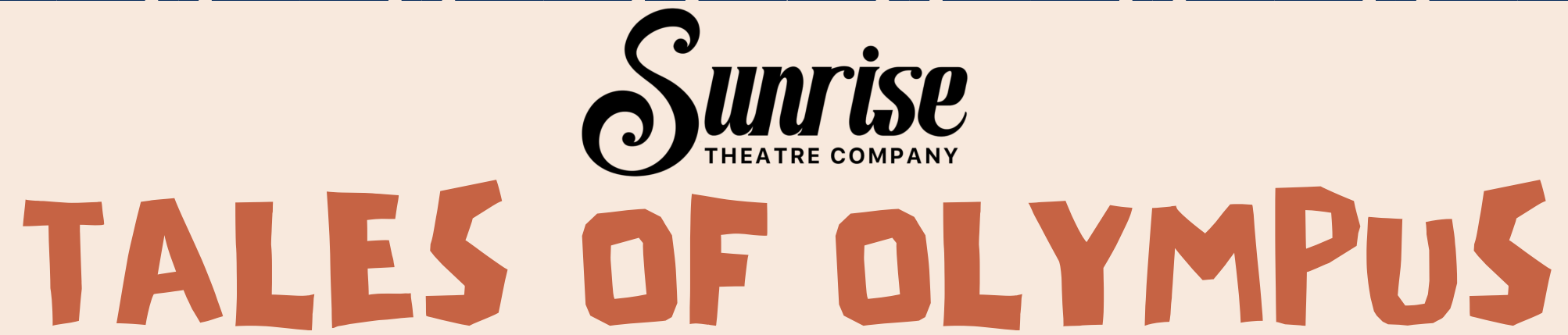
